Congregation Vote June 18

Motion to Begin Capital Campaign for New Preschool Building

The church council has set Sunday, June 18, 11:45am as the date and time for congregational meeting to vote on this motion:

"to authorize the Bethany Lutheran Church Council (1) to initiate a Capital Campaign for the construction of a Preschool Building, with an initial goal of approximately \$6,350,00; (2) to enter into construction contracts when \$4,500,000 (approximately 75% of the estimated \$5,830,000 construction costs) has been received; and (3) to allow payment of pre-construction architectural and capital campaign expenses of approximately \$520,000 once those funds have been received and are due. **The council will not incur debt without a congregation vote.*"

Handouts from the May 21st Town Hall presentations are available in the church office; also, the recording of the 9:30 am presentation is linked on Bethany's website. If the vote is "Yes," there are plans for both a church capital campaign and a community campaign. Should an option arise later for borrowing funds, the council would not do so without a congregational vote. Of course, if all funds are raised, we'd be ready to build. Pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit and discernment as we vote on June 18. (See article on page 4)

Parking Lot Update

A hearty thank you to everyone who has donated towards repairing Bethany's back parking lot. In

just a few week's time, we have raised \$27 thousand dollars. Bethany Preschool has pledged another \$15 thousand. We are well on our way.

Several property committee members met with representatives of Bennett Paving to get some further details and have questions answered regarding the project. Questions were answered to the satisfaction of those gathered, and Bennett was ready to start paving right away. Unfortunately, we had to tell them that we'd have to wait. We are still fundraising, and we cannot take on a debt without congregation approval.

We appreciate your willingness to give towards this project as it does reflect on our mission and ministry. Our back parking lot is a lot like our welcome mat. People notice, and it makes a difference when they see a well-kept lot. And, given that we do have a few folks who have difficulty walking, those bumps and divots are a safety hazard. Hopefully, we can get the monies raised before the end of summer, which is optimal paving time. Please make your contribution to the Capital Improvement Fund: Parking Lot.

Renovation Work in June

We tentatively planned on starting this project in mid-April, but some design issues needed more time. Our new schedule is to

start Sunday, June 4th, with volunteer work that afternoon (moving all furniture out of the Narthex and Triple Room, and removing all ceiling tiles, artwork, signage, bulletin boards, etc.). On **Monday, June 5th**, the painter and electrician will start their work (sheetrock, wainscoting refresh, resurfacing the hallway walls, fresh paint, new light fixtures, etc.). All church offices will be open as usual during the week. There will be signage indicating traffic patterns and elevator availability. Any meetings held during the week will be located somewhere other than the Triple Room. That Friday, June 9th, volunteers will clean up and get things ready for Sunday. You will be able to tell that work is in progress, but all Sunday services will function as usual.

Week 2 (June 12-16) will be for remaining work by the painter.

Week 3 (June 19-23) will be removing all carpeting and ceramic tiles prior to installation of new flooring in the Narthex.

Week 4 (June 26-30) will be the installation of new flooring in the hallway and the Triple Room.

We fully expect to have everything completed by **Sunday**, July 2nd, however, as with any renovation project, there may need to be some scheduling changes. That said, during the entire project, all offices will be open as usual, and all meetings will be held somewhere other than the Triple Room. At the end of each week, we will repeat the clean-up steps to prepare for Sunday services. Please note that Sunday School will be on summer break.

The Aesthetics and Property Committees thank you for your patience and flexibility during this process. We are delighted to have this opportunity to make our church more welcoming to all.



A New Preschool Building

In 2018, the citywide visioning process showed a crisis-level need for childcare. This spring, a

gathering of most preschool and community leaders showed that, while there may be a crisis in childcare for infants and the very young, there are currently adequate spaces for 3- and 4-year-olds. We cannot predict the need in 3 - 5 years, especially with 1,400 houses and apartments now being built. Here are some reasons the Building Committee has found for a new building for our preschool children:

- BPS is seeking to provide the best in faith-based learning for our community's kids.
- 85% of the children in our preschool are non-members; thus, this is clearly a community outreach and ministry.
- Because BPS is a non-profit and supported by the congregation of Bethany Lutheran Church, we strive to keep tuition costs low while still having a high quality staff. At this time, it is projected that, with the new building, BPS will have an increase in tuition costs, perhaps more than the Chamber of Commerce survey says the majority of families are willing to pay but much less than privatelyowned preschools. Our mission: stay affordable!
- BPS will have a state-of-the-art facility specifically built for young children
- A new building will have enhanced safety features including fully secure entrances/exits, immediate entry route to the playground with restrooms, security cameras, restrooms for each class, plus the office will be

located at the front entrance.

BPS is one of the few facilities opened year-round and providing extended childcare (7:00am to 5:30 pm)
 The new building would allow the possibility of doubling our current enrollment.

Dear Supporters,

The Gillespie Literacy Council would like to thank you for your support this past school year.

Classes were offered in Basic Literacy, ESL, and Citizenship. In addition, tutors helped 3 students study for state licensing tests and the GED. Our tutors bring a wealth of experience, talent, and dedication to our program.

Approximately 55 students registered for each session. This year our students came from Mexico, Guatemala, El Salvador, Argentina, Columbia, Honduras, Peru, Nicaragua, and the Ukraine. Students who attended classes regularly made notable progress. Educating the parent benefits the whole family.

Before Christmas the Fredericksburg Rotary Club distributed over 50 books to children and grandchildren of ESL students. In addition, each family received a bookshelf for their books. This was part of the Rotary Club's community literacy project.

Funding for the year's program came from St. Mary's Catholic Church, Bethany Lutheran Church, Zion Lutheran Church, Memorial Presbyterian Church, St. Vincent de Paul, The Bethany Foundation, Our Lady of Guadalupe Church, and individuals.

Teaching another person to speak, read, and write English is a priceless gift that benefits the community. Thank you for your support of this ministry.
