### Faith-raising above Fund-raising

Capital Campaign Kicks Off August 13

Probably the biggest thing to know about a capital campaign in a Lutheran church is that, first and foremost, it is a *faith-raiser* before it is a fund-raiser.

Whether you plan to give or not give a gift toward a new Preschool Building, I believe you will be blessed by the church Bible studies, prayer vigil, small-group gatherings, special worship services, and fellowship events. And it's not just for adults—it's for children and youth also.

The Capital Campaign Committee consists of 15 – 17 Bethany volunteers plus the pastors. We will be directed and guided by Dr. Luke Bouman of The Enrichment Group. Not only will he train the group, he'll also be with us on several Sundays. You may have met Luke—he did his internship at Zion Lutheran in Kerrville, then served as pastor in Hondo, Cedar Park, and Conroe.

Page 2 has a calendar of events. We'll begin with the faith-building and spiritual renewal, then in late October and early November move into the gift phase, followed by a 3-year pledge period.



# Capital Campaign Schedule

Our Capital Campaign Committee—the leadership core of the upcoming campaign—will have its training day on Saturday August 12 and then be

installed on "kickoff" Sunday August 13. They, in turn, will recruit many Bethany members to help with the events. It's Not Optimal, But...

If you worshiped at our Praise and Worship service towards the end of June and into July, you might have noticed the absence of live musicians leading our worship. On those Sundays, most of the band members of Agape Road were travelling and unable to be here, so we used prerecorded video songs and played them through the sound system.

It worked fairly well, though this is not necessarily our first choice of how to do things. We want live music and musicians to lead our worship. There's just something enlivening about singing with the band (and not to short traditional; having an organist/pianist and choir singing). However, we are having to face a very real reality in the U.S., particularly in rural, small town communities: there is a lack of church musicians who are willing to give of their time and talent on a voluntary basis.

In fact, we know of at least one other congregation In Fredericksburg who is paying musicians to drive from San Antonio to play and sing in their praise band because they cannot find local, volunteer musicians to do so.

One option would be to have no music at all, but that kind of defeats the purpose of the praise and worship service. Another option is to pay musicians to come in every time Agape Road goes on vacation, but that would necessitate increasing our budget quite a bit. And, finally, because of the technological improvements we made during COVID, we could use pre-recorded videos of Agape Road leading worship. That seemed to be the best option for us at this time. We understand that it is not optimal, but it still enables us to worship with the music we are used to singing performed by those we love to listen to and sing along with.

If you know of someone who has some musical gifts, encourage them to talk with Matt White, another member of Agape Road, or the pastors. Same goes for someone in traditional who might like to sing in the choir or begin learning how to play the organ under Margie or Annabel's tutorage. And let our musicians know that you appreciate them—whatever service you attend. They put in an awful lot of work to help us worship and sing God's praises—most of whom do it simply because they love God and love playing at church.

### The problem (and power) of money

[Jesus told the rich man] "You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." When he heard this, he was shocked and went away grieving, for he had many possessions. ...

[Jesus taught the disciples,] "It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." -Mark 10:21b-22. 25

At a Bible study, a man of means asked, "Why does Jesus hate money so much?" His family saw their money as a good thing, and he earnestly wanted to understand why Jesus seems to speak negatively of wealth again and again.

In fact, Jesus talks about money more than nearly anything else. Interestingly, for all his talk about money, he never asks for it. And he never condemns it. Instead, Jesus warns us about the corrupting influence of money.

Wealth poses spiritual risks. Jesus teaches that money has the power to turn us inward – away from loving God with all our heart and loving our neighbor as ourselves. It confuses our values and direction.

All of us want full lives brimming with security, relationship, joy, peace and love – but money can ensure us none of those things. They are the fruits of loving God with ALL our strength and of loving our neighbor as ourselves. Wealth can get in the way.

That was the issue with the rich man in Mark 10:17-27. Deeply religious, he nonetheless worries about eternal life. The "one thing" he lacks, Jesus tells him, can be satisfied by selling what he has and giving to the poor. Generous giving would break the bond that money has over him and help re-center him on loving God and loving neighbor.

Generosity is the spiritual prescription Jesus gives the rich man, and it's the one for us, too.

The primary goal of our church's financial stewardship should not be to fund the church, but rather to break the chains that money may have on our hearts and souls. But giving generously we can help the church, our neighbor and ourselves. We can learn what it is to be free to love God with all our heart and our neighbor as ourselves.

# Your Memorial Contributions: Where Do They Go?

Gifts at the Time of Death

Bethany is grateful for the many people who give memorial gifts and for families who list the Church, the Foundation, or the Preschool as suggested memorials when loved ones die.

### 1. Where can memorial gifts go?

(A) Memorials to "Bethany Lutheran Church" may go to:

**The Memorial Fund** (this is where gifts to the church go unless people designate otherwise; this fund is used for special purchases outside our regular operating budget)

The Preschool Building Fund (our future building)

The Hennig House Fund (upkeep & restoration)

Capital Improvements Fund (for church property)

**Other** designated funds or the General Fund are available; you can check with the pastors or financial secretary.

- (B) Memorials to "Bethany Lutheran Foundation" support the perpetual fund established as a separate entity in 2007. The Foundation grows via estate gifts, memorial gifts, & investments. Annual grants go to Bethany church, preschool, & community organizations. Checks must be made to the Bethany Foundation.
- **(C) Memorials to "Bethany Lutheran Preschool**" support Bethany's weekday ministry for young children in our congregation and community. Checks must be made to *Bethany Preschool*.

#### 2. Who decides where gifts go?

- (A) The donor. The family of the deceased can *suggest* but IRS rules require that donations follow the *donor's* designation.
- (B) Once given to the church, foundation, or preschool, that entity decides how the donations will be used for purchases. The family of the deceased may suggest *the fund* but they cannot designate any purchases (unless the family itself makes the complete donation for a specific, approved purchase.)

# Bethany Foundation Grant Applications Available August 1, 2023

Bethany Lutheran Foundation of Fredericksburg, Texas, Inc. will begin accepting grant applications from nonprofit organizations on August 1, 2023. The Foundation, whose mission is to Advance and Support the Discipleship of Jesus Christ, was established in 2007 with funds received from the estate of Bethany member Alma Braeutigam. The Foundation continues to be supported by Bethany members and the public through donations, memorials, and bequests. The Foundation is managed by a nine-member governing board elected by the Bethany congregation. Current board members are Sharon Joseph, Joyce Richey, Erik Iverson, Merrily Hartmann, Beth Luckenbach, Weldon Itz, Mike Sedgwick, Dana Rowan and Lindy Haley.

To date, Bethany Lutheran Foundation has awarded \$469,206.00 to community nonprofit organizations whose outreach programs serve children, seniors, veterans, families and the developmentally disabled, as well as housing, counseling, emergency services and Christian Ministry programs. CHANGE? We've all heard the old joke: "How many Lutherans does it take to change a lightbulb? The answer: "Change????" Most people find change to be either difficult or a delight. Case in point, all the changes in our

narthex and triple room (now known as the Conference Room) are new and delightful. Artwork placement in the new areas were carefully considered by our Aesthetics Committee and show the growth of Bethany from the old Bethany down the street (picture was painted by Christine Ottmers, Troy's grandmother); then the 1963 Bethany painted by John McCluskey, and then the present day architect's rendering of our present plant (dedicated in the year 2000).

Note: John McClusky was a professional artist who joined Bethany and his wife Lois served as organist for many years. Two other paintings by John are the landscape hung above the guest register and the one on the landing going up to the balcony. It was painted following a Christmas Sunday School program and includes children who are now adults. These two paintings are on loan from Donna Mittel.

Gone is the red curtain that was to the right of the sanctuary doors, and is replaced by the painting by the late Marie Dietrich, which was gifted to Bethany by her family after her death. Other prints in the narthex are by Charles Beckendorf and Dalhart Windberg. New lighting and ceiling tiles in the narthex and conference room really highlight the artwork.

The décor in the conference room, still to be completed, includes a painting of the Hennig house by artist Mark Haworth and we will utilize the banner, pulpit and lectern hangings that were used in Bethany's 100 th celebration in 1987. They were created by Carol Bade and are as beautiful today as when she completed them.

Also to be added will be photos of past Bethany groups. These were found in the archives and will be framed and hung. The hallway will feature bulletin boards and additional artwork.

The Aesthetics Committee worked diligently to provide a welcoming area and we are deeply grateful for all the positive feedback received.
