A Burning Fire by Pastor Kevin Haug

"2-And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. 3-Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them." Acts 2:2-3

The day of Pentecost. The promised Holy Spirit came and ignited deep within the disciples a burning fire to spread the Gospel-to proclaim the mighty acts of God accomplished in Christ Jesus. It is appropriate that one of the main symbols of this day is a flame.

That flame did not diminish within the disciples as they marched out into the world to share the good news, and it cost them. Most paid with their lives, but for them, it was a small price. What had happened within them because of the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus could not be silenced; could not be compromised on; could not let them rest. They had to tell. The burning flame had an eternal source of fuel.

That eternal source was the love of God poured out for sinners at the cross. So often, in the church, we tend to focus on what we are supposed to do, and we get tired. There is one more meeting, one more worship service, one more class, one more pot luck, one more activity, one more thing to give to. Fatigue sets in, and the church slows down. When we focus on what we should do.

But if the focus is different: if the focus is on what God has done: if the focus is on God's great grace and love, then things change. The fire is kindled. The fire grows. The fire overrides exhaustion because there is a mission of great importance. There is a mission that captures our hearts. The news must go out. Lives must be transformed. It cannot be silenced. Be, live as, and make disciples of Jesus Christ. Let the fire burn.

The "third" major festival of the church year—after Easter and Christmas—is the Day of Pentecost which falls 50 days after Easter (thus "pente"). It was originally a Jewish holiday celebrated on the fiftieth day

after Passover, also known as the "Feast of Weeks" and the "Feast of 50 days." Which is why Jerusalem was full of tourists, including Parthians, Medes, Elamites, Asians, Egyptians, and Libyans. On that day described in Acts 2, the Holy Spirit descended upon disciples of Jesus with wind and fire, and they spoke in other languages. They proclaimed Jesus as Savior and Lord... as we still do today, by the power of the same Holy Spirit. As a festive sign of this great festival, let's all wear red June 5!


Our tweets were the chapel bells signaling





Council Highlights—


May 17, 2022

Don't Let Your Offerings Take a Holiday



Ahhh, summer! A time to relax and grab much-needed R & R. Vacations and weekend

getaways may keep you away from church, but our congregation is still bustling with activity. The bills never take a summer holiday.

It's enormously helpful to the congregation's balance sheet if your gifts, tithes and offerings continue to come in regularly, even if you are away. Here are some ideas for staying current:

Pay in advance: Plan ahead by offering more in the weeks in advance of your time away from church.

Make it up: When you return, give a little more in the weeks that follow.

Use your envelopes: Here's a tip that's good not only for summer, but year-round: If you use giving envelopes and checks, simply prepare them weeks in advance and bring them to church when convenient.

Use banking bill pay: Most online banking services will write and send checks for you. Just plug in the church address, the amount of the gift and how often you want it sent. Viola! You're done!

Enroll in electronic giving: Use the congregation's online giving portal to regularize your gift, tithe or offering.

Give monthly or quarterly: Sometimes it's hard to anticipate how many Sundays you'll be away from church. Planning your gift, tithe or offering for monthly or quarterly can keep you current. Of course, these methods are beneficial not only for the summer months, but also for the whole year through. Those who embrace giving as a spiritual discipline often find that their lives of faith are enriched, and their sense of joy and fulfillment is deepened. Choosing a regular-giving strategy can help you to discover the joys of generosity.


