A Moment No One Saw By Pastor Casey

Easter begins in grief. It is, after all, to a tomb that the women come early on the first day of the week. They had all witnessed his gruesome death on Good Friday, crucified on the hill between two criminals. There was such a hurry to get him buried before the Sabbath began, so now that Sabbath had passed, they came to the tomb with spices, still reeling from the fact that the one they thought they could never live without was now dead and gone.

But something happened inside that tomb in the wee hours of the third day, something no human witnessed: Jesus came alive. Sure, they would all meet him alive and well again after the resurrection. But no one actually witnessed that miraculous instant inside that tomb when life came again to his lifeless corpse, and he rose up. That moment was just between Jesus and his Heavenly Father.

I have several times seen life go out of a person as I stood beside their death-bed...a last breath, then no more. Like a candle

snuffed out. But imagine life coming back into a person. I wonder if it's like the big bang of creation when God said "Let there be light." That would blow the stone door off the tomb! And Jesus would shine for a moment with incredible light, from the inside out. Which would let him know again what he's really made of. Light and life.

"Taffy" and Curtis Cameron have been married 57 years and are blessed with 2 daughters Kalen and Cyrena. Kalen is married (John Sledge) with 3 children Ellen, Allie, and Emma Kate. Cyrena is married (Buck Benson) with 3 children Claire, Curtis, and Kathleen. Both live in San Antonio.

"Taffy" born Mary Katharine Redman spent her early years in
Saint Jo, Texas. She got the name "Taffy" when her
brother couldn't pronounce Kathy, and it stuck. At 14 she left home
for boarding school, an all-girls institution. Later, she would go to
the University of Texas, where she stayed in the Scottish Rite
Dorm. Her daughters were the 3rd generation to stay there.
She graduated with a degree in teaching majoring in English.

Curtis was born and raised in Fredericksburg, graduating from FHS where he participated in sports and in Ag. His fondest memory was of Joe Tatum who taught Ag. Curtis said "He taught parliamentary procedure and to think while standing on your feet. Curtis graduated from SWT with a degree in Business.

They met on a blind date, set up by Judy Enderlin who Taffy had known in college. After they married, they settled in Fredericks-burg. They built their home in 1971; on land Curtis had known since childhood.

As a family, the Cameron's thrived, but never forgot their roots.

Curtis, a fixture in the town's leadership, was a member of the Board of Directors of Fredericksburg National Bank and Bank One. He believed in serving his community, having been President of the Fair Association in 1965 and 1976, and later a Lifetime Honorary Director. He served twelve years as a Gillespie County Commissioner and is a member of the Rotary Club.

Taffy, too, gave herself to the community, volunteering at the hospital for over 20 years. She is also involved with the Historical Society, serving on the board and ensuring the town's legacy remains alive. To them Fredericksburg is not just a place-- it is their home, and they believe it is their responsibility to preserve our future's history.

Though they both were active in their community they are finding themselves in a new chapter, filled with doctor's appointments, slower days, and moments of reflection.

Curtis, deeply rooted in Zion's history, attends Bethany with Taffy where she has been active in the Altar Guild and constantly seeking new ways to serve.

Together, Taffy and Curtis have left a mark on Fredericksburg, one that will be felt for generations to come. And even as the years slip by, they remain as committed as ever to living lives of purpose, 11 faith, and love.

One of her greatest joys is teaching children of parents she taught.

George, a Clinical Social worker, retired from BAMC when they moved.Sadly, he passed away very suddenly in 2021.

Their oldest son, Lance tragically passed away at 9 from meningitis.Laith is a professional musician traveling in and out of the country.

The couple frequently took her grandmother, Mrs. Edda Ottmers and Walter to their ranch in Medina. Mrs. Ottmers, a long-standing member of Bethany reached the remarkable age of 104. It was natural to join Bethany when they moved here.

Sandy's love for travel, especially to the Bahamas, is well-known. The
 teachers at Regency presented her with a license plate "Bahama Mama."
 She continues to visit Abaco Island, where she enjoys gifting children
 their own personal books. In addition to her teaching at FISD, she has
 worked at Bethany preschool and its After School program & ushers at
 contemporary.

She loves the welcoming atmosphere of Bethany and the wonderful

Lifeboat Log: April 2025

Most of you are aware of Bethany's Outreach & Team (BOAT) and our mission statement to "Advocate for our neighbors in need while seeking avenues for help and implementing real-world assistance." Our most recog-

nized operations are the Lifeboat, our Little Free Food Pantry next to the Hennig House, and our quarterly free Car Care Clinics.

We'd like to acquaint you with two of BOAT's other on-going community efforts:

First is a band of devoted volunteers who, under the leadership of BOAT member *Tammy Schmidt Keener*, routinely send postcards to inmates of the Gillespie County Jail Facility. Each month, Tammy secures a list of those currently incarcerated in our local jail, and shares the names with her volunteers, who pen messages of faith, hope, and grace to those inmates.

The postcards include Bethany's mission statement and the encouragement that "We are forgiven and given new life through faith in Him." There's a space on the front of the cards for each writer to include a meaningful Biblical quote or other words of faithful encouragement.

This intrepid band of correspondents has recently been dubbed the "Logos Team," since "logos" in Greek means "word," "discourse," or "reason" and was used by early Christians to refer to the Word of God recorded in the Bible.

Although the program is not generally reciprocal – this is not intended as a "pen pal" situation – an occasional missive arrives. Most recently, "Ramiro" replied to one of the Logos Team's cards in a letter saying, in part, "Thank you for the Bible verses. I read them every day and they lift my spirits."

Katie's life in Fredericksburg has helped her discover her own strength and independence. Though living far from her family was challenging, she cherishes her ability to thrive on her own. She values loyalty and importance of having people she can rely on. Katie works at Mother's Day Out, volunteers at Bethany's Pre-school, helps with Faith Foundations, Jump Start and on church council.

Katie and Derek's discovery of Bethany had them realize they found more than just a church—they found a family. With close friendships formed, they have truly made Bethany their home. They are grateful for the life they've built together, filled with love, faith, and community. Their dedication to family, commitment to serving others, they embody the spirit of Fredericksburg and Bethany, making an impact on those around them.

Ann Hostetter

Ann Hostetter has called Fredericksburg home for over 40 years, but her journey began in Lancaster, in the north of England. She grew up alongside two sisters and a brother, spending her early years in England and Wales
 until the age of 13. Her family moved to Aden (now part of Yemen)
 for 2 years before returning to England for 3 years. Their travels continued
 with a move to Bahrain for another two years.

Ann met her husband, Larry, a drilling superintendent in the oil fields,
while living in Bahrain. Originally from Odessa, Texas, Larry asked Ann on a
