A Friday of Prayer

New Sunday Radio Schedule

And one of the best places to see it in the USA is... Fredericksburg. We're in the path of totality.

Are you available to monitor parking or observation space for our Bethany paved parking lot? Those are two options we're considering, in addition to simply closing the lot. Realize, however, that any Bethany volunteers may not be able to drive home for at least 6 hours due to traffic congestion. So the most likely candidates to volunteer would be people who live near Bethany and would walk home.

The western unpaved "Hennig Lot" will possibly be used by vendors (or closed to traffic for observation space).

FYI: we will close our entrances Thursday April 4 until Sunday morning worship April 7, to avoid campers and tents being set up and thus allow for Sunday morning worship parking.





As many of you may have experienced, growing up in Fredericksburg, (I remember when I was in middle school) Wednesdays were considered as church days and seemed to be sacred. We never had games on Wednesdays, and after school practice was always over in time for us to walk to church for Confirmation. But that is not the case anymore as our society seems to continue to move at a faster pace. We, as a church, need to find ways to keep up with that fast pace, while remaining committed to teaching and passing on the faith to the next generations. April 2-11 I'm heading to Kansas City, Missouri, and while I'm there, I'll be visiting three different Lutheran churches in the area to talk with their pastors and staff about how Confirmation programs work in their churches. I'm also planning on sitting in on a few Confirmation classes. I'm hoping to learn a few things from my colleagues in Kansas and be able to bring those ideas home to help reshape what Bethany's middle school programs will look like in the future. April 13-18 I'll be headed to San Juan, Puerto Rico. Bethany's high school youth are preparing to go to Puerto Rico for a mission trip with Cross Trails, and I'm blessed to be able to go ahead of time to scope things out and make some connections while I am there. I'll be doing some projects with Cross Trails Ministry alongside other adults from Palm Valley Lutheran in Round Rock and Emanuel's Lutheran Church in Seguin. April 19, my cousin is getting married in Kyle, so I'll rush back for that, and then I'll take the rest of my time in April to rest and reflect. While I'm away, CYFM is helping to find substitutes on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Sundays to teach in my place. I am so very grateful for Bethany youth and families, and all of our members who are committed to helping raise the next generations in their faith in Christ Jesus. Please keep our youth programs in prayer in April. I'm not very good at asking, but I would also appreciate your prayers as I travel, learn, grow and rest, while encountering Jesus along the way. Thank you for giving me this gift of time.

A Few Words from our Youth Minister _{Kiesha Priem}

"Sabbatical? What's that?" That's usually the question I get when I talk about the journey I'm about to embark on. In the words of Steve Dulin, Sabbatical time is used "to strengthen your relationship with the Lord. The word 'sabbatical' comes from the word 'Sabbath,' which is a day of rest dedicated to God. Essentially, a sabbatical is several Sabbaths put together." So, I am taking some time away to study, learn, grow in faith, and rest. (And I'm coming back! Don't worry!)


of time.

other events (both school sanctioned and extracurricular) on (Continued on page 25.)




Building Bright Futures Community Campaign Launches in March






