Spiritual Therapy

It just hit me—the "age" thing. Many of you already know the aches and pains that just appear one day. Out of nowhere! (Or, so it seems.) Some of you noticed me walking a little more gingerly in recent weeks, with a different gait. Several weeks ago, my lower back started hurting. Then pain went down my legs. Then to my feet. "Spinal stenosis," the doctor said after the MRI. Well, crud.

Now, I've had my first session of Physical Therapy. And it wasn't what I thought. I expected my old football coach's words: "Make it hurt! No pain no gain." Nope. My first PT session and assignment involved positioning my legs and hips and holding for 3 minutes. Turns out, I've been using the wrong muscles. The therapist explained that holding certain positions for 3 minutes each day retrains my brain to use the muscles God intended to be used.

Which made me think of the term "Spiritual Therapy." What can retrain our hearts, minds, and souls for a healthy relationship with God and one other? Does it sometimes take a spiritual or emotional pain to get us to seek health? Perhaps spending an hour in worship is a kind of therapy—we hear Scripture, we commune, we sing some songs and say our prayers. Maybe we take the practice of praying and reading Scripture home. And... God retrains us, again.

Update on Community Capital Campaign For New Bethany Preschool Building

On Sunday, September 22, Jody Donovan, community capital campaign chair, gave an update at all three worship services on the progress being made on the community outreach for the Bethany Preschool Building Capital Campaign.

As of August 31st, a total of \$3,456,208 has been raised for the capital campaign to build a new facility for our preschool. Of that total members of Bethany have given or pledged \$2.5 million. Individuals, businesses and organizations in Fredericksburg and Gillespie County, as well as foundations, have given or pledged another \$1 million toward our goal.

Donovan also noted that \$300,000 has been raised toward reaching the \$400,000 matching grant from Mary Porter.

The Capital Campaign Committee is thankful for everyone who has stepped up to help move us toward the goal of \$7 million. The estimated total cost of the project increased from \$6.3 million due to expected inflation over the next two years.

Donovan also reminded congregational members who are over 73 that they can direct their IRA required minimum distribution directly to the Bethany Preschool Building Fund to avoid taxes. Work with your tax professional to make sure all IRS regulations are followed.

The Capital Campaign Committee needs "a helping hand" to identify potential donors. If you know of any philanthropists, businesses, individuals, foundations or organizations who you think might like to help us reach our goal, please contact the pastors or Donovan at (830)997-4763.



Skyrocketing Insurance

As noted last month, we had an unex-FOR YOUR INFORMATION. pected rise in insurance costs which will affect our budget. Our longtime

insurer Church Mutual, which had increased premiums this year, dropped us in August (they'd already dropped many churches earlier). Our administrator Layne contacted many, many underwriters and most would not consider us. Three companies sent proposals, and the cost went from \$32,000 to \$60,000 for our liability, auto, property, and umbrella insurance. See the front page article in last month's Bells.

We know that Bethany is a generous congregation and that you have continually stepped up to handle financial challenges. This year, we have stayed in the black the vast majority of the time because of your tremendous giving. We thank you for this, and know that it will continue.

Dianna, honored as the Chamber Woman of the Year, closed Blumenhandler in 2020, marking the end of a vibrant chapter in her life.

Now, they dedicate their time to being Gamma & Papa to their two granddaughters, Cora & Nova, who, along with their parents Stacey &
Stephen York, are members of Bethany. The Blounts cherish their military life & Don's love of flying, but they feel especially blessed to have settled in Fredericksburg. Watching their grandchildren develop roots



Martin Luther's most underappreciated theological insight may have been "the priesthood of all believers." Simply put, Luther observed that God calls all Christians – not just pastors – to lives of holiness. It's a simple idea, and one that certainly elevates our "job" to a new status, but it can be hard to live out. Here are some tips:

Council Highlights



September 17, 2024

- Bell tower roof is leaking; P&M (R Rode) estimates ~\$5000 needed for repairs. Council approved taking this from the contingency fund. Long term, the bell tower roof will need to be replaced in next few years.
- A discussion was had regarding a probable significant expenditure needed for ~25 yr old AC unit/compressor for basement below FH. Equipment is located in FH attic and requires significant equipment/labor to access. Need to consider if FH AC unit should be replaced at same time. No decision was made as we are still in diagnosis stage.
- Kiesha will be taking the 2nd half of her sabbatical (Oct 14 -Nov 11).

Council approved the benefit package (Portico Gold) for full time staff.
